

Spanning three consecutive weekends, students will learn about and actively participate in the wood firing process from start to finish; through glazing of their work, loading, firing, and cleaning up afterwards. Fire The Bray's Train Kiln over the course of a 48 hour period, while learning about, and achieve effects that are unique to the process. Those interested must be available for every class session before and after the firing, and be available for (at minimum) a 6-hour shift on the kiln the weekend of the firing. Each student can expect to get 6 cubic feet of work fired, but more importantly, learn lots about the process of wood firing!

Please Note: There is no studio time/making time as a part of this class. This class is intended for students who are enrolled in another Continuing Education class or have studio access elsewhere.

Heidi McKay Casto creates objects that explore the intersections of utility and sculpture, and feature a variety of playful design elements, anthropomorphic animal portraits, and vibrant colors. Her work explores similarities between instinctual animal behaviors, and behaviors learned through her lived experience as a woman, artist, and mother, gaining insight and inspiration for living with fewer



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insecurities and societal pressures. Heidi desires for the work to be a synchronistic exchange of connection where care and beauty are more present in daily life for users, and where complex human emotions might be made more discernible through light-hearted depictions of anthropomorphized animal subjects.
