

Raising Awareness



The first week of May is Missing and Murdered Indigenous Peoples awareness week.

The Bray would like to highlight recent Invited Visiting Artist Cannupa Hanska Luger and the monumental artwork EVERY ONE (2018) which utilizes over 4,000 ceramic beads created by hundreds of communities across the US and Canada to raise awareness around MMIP and advocate for violence prevention.

Cannupa joins numerous Indigenous advocates and artists calling for attention to the still under acknowledged issue of missing and murdered Indigenous women, girls, queer, and transgender people.

Recognizing the connection between lumber, oil, and gas industry and increased murders and disappearances of Indigenous people, primarily women, across the US and Canada, this work asks us to shoulder some culpability in the processes that lead to such violence and to find ways to take action and heal. Cannupa is committed to continue to raise awareness with EVERY ONE, participating in and supporting community work centered in violence prevention in tribal communities across the nation, and we at The Bray continue to learn how to be better allies for Indigenous communities facing this issue.

The Bray is looking forward to working with Cannupa for his next social collaboration clay bead project, launching this spring. Stay tuned for ways you can get involved.

The Archie Bray Foundation recognizes and honors the Indigenous peoples of this region on whose ancestral lands the Foundation now stands. We believe that acknowledging and reflecting upon the contemporary lived experience and history of the Indigenous peoples here in Montana and around the world are essential steps toward creating a more equitable world.
